This guide can help you get settled, stay connected, and take advantage of everything NKC has to offer.

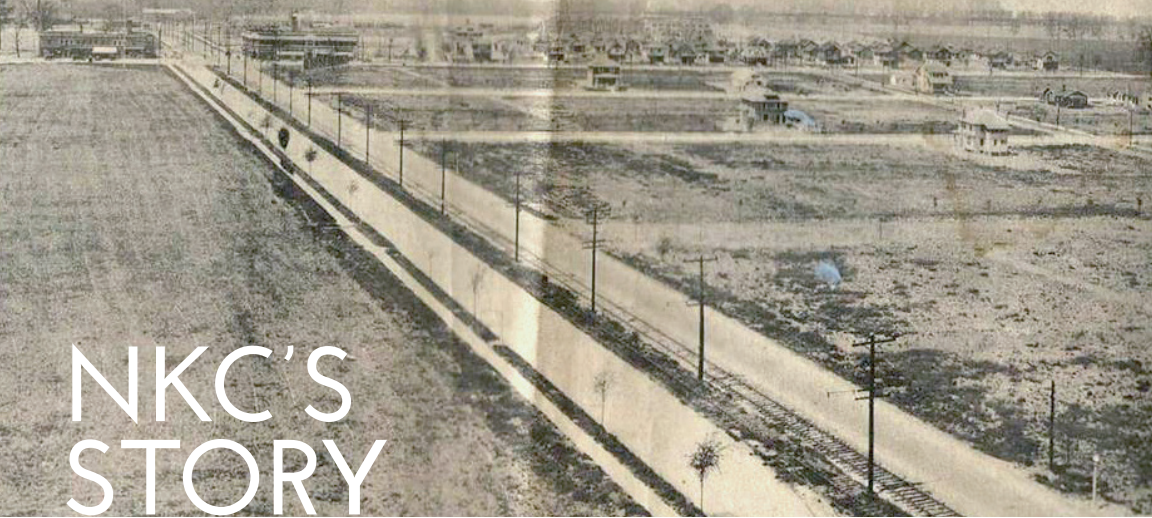
OUR MISSION

YOUR CITY GOVERNMENT

NKC operates under a Mayor–City Council–City Administrator form of government. The elected City Council sets policy, approves the budget, and establishes the City's vision. The City Administrator carries out those policies and oversees daily operations, supported by dedicated departments that deliver essential services like public safety, public works, and development.

NKC'S STORY

In 1883, Willard E. Winner arrived in the area with a bold vision: to build a new city and bridge across the Missouri River. He constructed a rock road—now Swift Street—and began planning a town he called North Kansas City.

Unlike most cities that grow organically, North Kansas City was carefully planned from the start. Homes, retail districts, industrial areas, paved and lit streets, a waterworks system, and parks were all laid out before the first residents arrived.

The town was officially incorporated on November 4, 1912.

While Winner wasn't able to see his plan completed, the North Kansas City Development Company—formed by Armour Meat, Swift Meat Packing, and the Burlington Railroad—brought his vision to life.

Today, North Kansas City is a thriving, progressive community where residents, businesses, and city government work together to build a vibrant future.

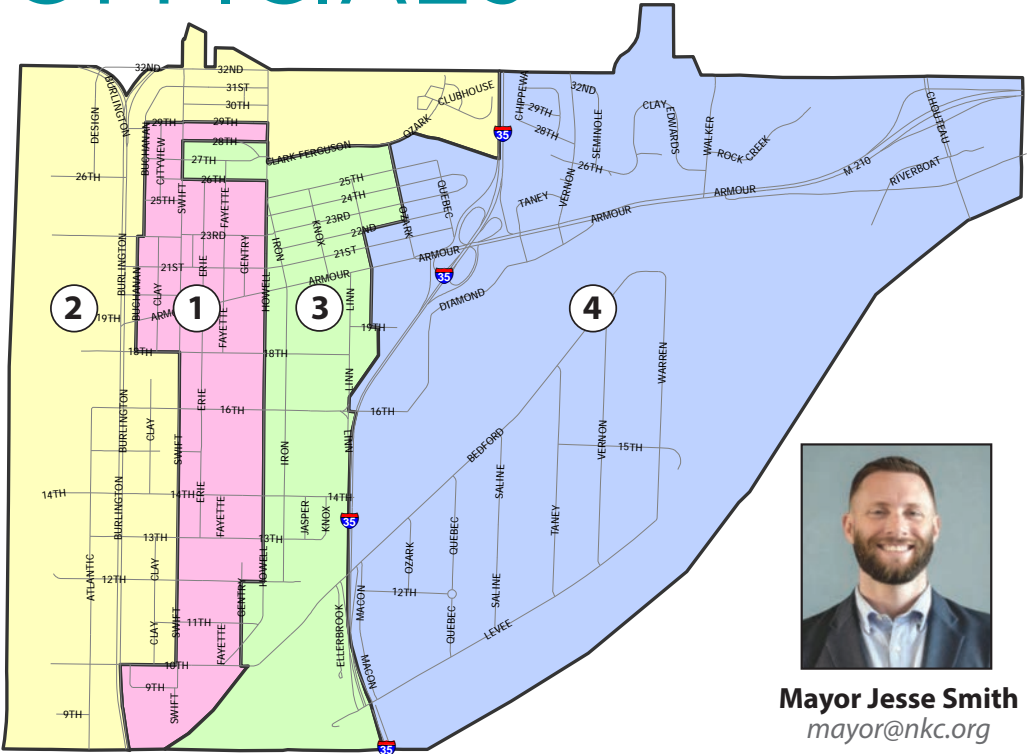
WHO WAS HERE FIRST?

North Kansas City is often confused with Kansas City, North. NKC got its name because, at the time, it was north of Kansas City. Here is a brief timeline of when cities started establishing in the northland:

- 1822** Liberty, Mo., incorporated.
- 1838** Town of Kansas, Mo., was founded (later becoming Kansas City).
- 1844** Parkville, Mo., incorporated.
- 1850** Kansas City, Mo., incorporated as a town, then city in 1853 (.7 miles).
- 1912** North Kansas City, Mo., incorporated.
- 1940-50s** Kansas City began annexing land. In 1946, Kansas City annexed 19-square-miles in Clay County, and 62-square-miles in Jackson County.
- 1951** Riverside, Mo., incorporated.
- 1952** Gladstone, Mo., incorporated.
- 1960-70s** Kansas City began annexing large amounts land, covering approximately 316-square-miles, more than five times its size in 1940. Much of this annexation was in the northland.

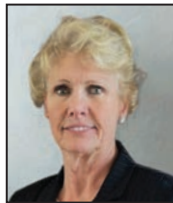

Did you know North Kansas City operates its own fiber-optic

broadband network? liNKCity delivers high-speed internet to both businesses and homes across the city.

For residents in North Kansas City proper, basic service includes lightning-fast 1 Gbps (1,000 Mbps) internet—with no monthly fee! There's just a one-time

\$300 activation fee due at the time of service activation.

Some apartment residents may not have access to liNKCity through a wall port. But good news—the City is partnering with KC Fiber to expand our free public Wi-Fi network throughout NKC, so you may still be able to connect through that system.

SOLID WASTE SERVICES

The City of North Kansas City provides solid waste collection for single-family homes, row homes, and four-plex residences. This includes household trash, recycling, yard waste, and bulky item pickup—all managed by our Public Works Department.

If you live in an apartment, condo, or building with five or more units, your trash service is arranged separately through your property management company. For questions about your building’s trash schedule or service provider, please contact your property manager directly.



Each Tuesday, GFL will collect the contents of your trash and recycling carts. Please follow these tips for easy and efficient collection.

- Set materials at the curb by 7 a.m. on Tuesday.
- Place carts within three feet of the curb, away from other objects, not blocking sidewalks, and with wheels facing the residence.

HOUSE LINE COLLECTION PROGRAM

Residents with mobility challenges who do not have another household member to assist may qualify for House Line Collection. To learn if you qualify, please contact Public Works at 816-274-6004.

PROPER TRASH, RECYCLING, AND YARD WASTE CONTAINER PLACEMENT

DO

Place waste containers in your yard, near the sidewalk, or on your private driveway. If you have a slope near the sidewalk, place your container at the top of the slope or preferably in your driveway.

DON'T

Place containers on the sidewalk or in the street. Placing obstructions on public sidewalks or in the street is in violation of the Municipal Code.



All trash/recycling must be placed in containers; only items in the containers will be collected. Residents can purchase excess stickers at City Hall or by calling 816-380-5595. A sheet of 5 stickers costs \$10. Each additional bag must have an excess sticker and be placed next to the trash cart.

Containers should be stored inside or on your side/rear yard next to the house. Empty containers should be removed from curbside/alleyway and stored the evening of pickup.

BULKY ITEM PICK UP FIRST TUESDAY OF THE MONTH

GFL will collect up to five residential bulk items per residence on the first Tuesday collection of each month. Bulky items are household items that one or two individuals can reasonably carry.

- Includes: couches, chairs, dressers, mattresses, tables, desks, windows, doors, etc.
- Excludes: electronics waste items such as televisions and computer monitors, hazardous wastes, tires and automotive parts, appliances, and construction materials.
- Appliances must be certified free of Chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs).

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) includes household cleaners, lawn and garden products, automobile fluids, insecticides, paints and paint-related products, and other common products.

NKC residents may drop off HHW products at no charge at the HHW Facility at 4707 Deramus, Kansas City, MO 64120. (*Proof of residency required.*)

The Community Development Department plans for future development, issues permits and inspects ongoing projects, and ensure that existing buildings and neighborhoods are well maintained. Services include:

Do I need a permit to ____? It can be difficult to know whether a small (or big) project around the house needs a permit. Below is a chart listing what common home improvements do and do not require a building permit.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Public Works is responsible for the management, maintenance, and enhancement of infrastructure in North Kansas City. This includes traffic signals and traffic flow, water distribution, sanitary sewer, and stormwater, and solid waste removal.



Services include:

- Solid waste removal
- City tree planting and maintenance
- Right-of-Way permits
- Water, wastewater, and stormwater distribution and infrastructure maintenance
- Maintenance of sidewalks, streets, streetlights & traffic signals

RESIDENT RESOURCES

Did you know North Kansas City offers services you won't find in most other communities? From free citywide Wi-Fi through LiNKCity, to curbside leaf vacuuming, and block party grants—NKC provides residents with truly unique amenities that set us apart. These services are designed to make daily life more convenient, connected, and community-focused.

FALL LEAF PICKUP

In the fall, North Kansas City's tree canopy bursts into shades of red and gold. It also brings us piles and piles of fallen leaves. Fortunately, Public Works provides special assistance with all those leaves! From March to December, leaves and grass clippings can be placed in biodegradable paper bags (which are available at City Hall for the discounted price of 10 for \$2) and put out at the curb for pickup each Wednesday.

From October to December, the City uses a leaf vacuum truck to gather leaves. All you need to do is rake your

leaves to the curb, and crews will come by and vacuum them up each week free of charge!

- Be sure that you rake your leaves into the grassy area NEXT TO the sidewalk—not ON the sidewalk!
- Never rake or blow yard waste into the street.

Leaves can clog storm drains and increase the likelihood of flooding. Remember, any debris entering the storm drain is untreated, and deposits directly into rivers, lakes, and streams. These pollutants affect drinking water quality, wildlife, and natural vegetation.



RESIDENT RATES FOR YMCA MEMBERSHIPS

North Kansas City residents receive 50% off memberships at the NKC YMCA! These rates are made possible thanks to the partnership between the City and the YMCA. Membership includes:

- Free Classes - Group exercise and water fitness classes.
- Start Strong - FREE Member Orientation includes three sessions with a wellness coach.
- Make a Splash - Indoor pool for exercise year-round.
- Kids Zone - Free childcare for ages 12 weeks to 8 years while you work out.

NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK PARTY GRANTS

NKC residents may apply for a grant to host a neighborhood block party. Each grant will reimburse eligible expenses, up to \$400 per event. Eligible expenses include food, paper goods and entertainment/performers. Ineligible expenses include alcohol, tent and stage/riser rentals.

Block parties must be approved by means of a short-term conditional use permit. Neighborhoods may receive the block party grant once per year. For more information, visit www.nkc.org/blockparty or call 816-274-6006.



ANIMAL VACCINATION DAY

Free rabies shots for pets of residents of North Kansas City are available at City Hall in May. *(Proof of residency required.)*

During the event, residents will also be able to get their annual pet license. Licenses are free to all spayed or neutered pets; otherwise the cost is \$5 per pet.

Other vet services are available for a fee, no checks accepted.



MINOR HOME REPAIR AND HOME MODIFICATION PROGRAM

North Kansas City partners with Northland Neighborhoods, Inc. and Rebuilding Together Kansas City to help low- to moderate-income homeowners with important home repairs. This program supports residents who may not have the financial means to address code violations or make modifications that improve mobility and accessibility.

Eligible repairs and modifications may include:

- Bathroom and shower modifications
- Repairing or replacing steps, stair railings, and walkways
- Minor electrical and plumbing repairs
- HVAC repair or replacement
- Exterior home repairs

GORMAN POOL PASS PROGRAM

North Kansas City residents can purchase City-subsidized pool passes to the Anita Gorman Pool, located in Gorman Park (1101 NE 47th St., Kansas City, MO). Passes are typically available at City Hall beginning the first week of May. The pool is open daily from Noon to 6 p.m.

CITYWIDE GARAGE SALE

North Kansas City hosts two Citywide Garage Sales each year—on the third Saturday of May and September. No permit is required to participate, making it easy for everyone to join in. In case of bad weather, the sale will be held the following Saturday.

Permits are required for all other garage sales outside of the Citywide dates.

PUBLIC TRANSIT INFORMATION

Whether you're commuting to work, connecting to regional transit, running errands, or enjoying everything NKC has to offer, several public transportation options are available to help you get where you need to go.

KCATA REGIONAL BUS SERVICE

CLAY COUNTY SENIOR SERVICES TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE

Clay County Senior Services partners with several providers to offer low-cost transportation options for residents 60 years and older.

- Individuals may use this service up to 3 round trips per month.
- \$7 rides per person/per ride if you are ambulatory.
- \$10 rides per person/per ride if you need a wheelchair lift.

RESIDENT TIPS

ANIMAL CONTROL & PET OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES

Thinking about adding a furry friend to your family? Before turning to breeders or pet stores, consider adoption through the North Kansas City Animal Shelter. Our fees are just \$105 for dogs and \$95 for cats, and each adoption includes:

- Spay/neuter surgery
- Vaccinations
- Health testing (heartworm, FIV/FelV)
- Rabies certificate

The Animal Shelter is open Tuesday–Friday from 2–6 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., and Mondays and Sundays by appointment. For more information, call (816) 274-6024.

Adopting a pet comes with important responsibilities to keep both your new companion and the community safe.

DOGS After you've adopted your new K9, remember to follow our leash laws. Dogs must always be on a leash when

outdoors—unless safely contained by a fence or chain—and you must maintain physical control at all times. These rules protect your dog from traffic and other hazards while ensuring the safety and comfort of your neighbors, their pets, and the entire community.

CATS Cats don't require leashes, but it's important to be mindful of both your neighbors and wildlife. Free-roaming cats face risks from traffic, predators, and illness, and they are also a leading threat to songbirds. Neighbors may have allergies, pets, or simply prefer their gardens, flower beds, and vehicles free from uninvited animals. For your cat's safety, consider keeping your pet indoors or providing a secure outdoor enclosure.

CRIME PREVENTION

Keeping North Kansas City safe is a team effort. While our Police Department is dedicated to protecting and serving, they can't do it alone. Crime prevention works best when neighbors look out for one another, report suspicious activity, and share information with officers. Your awareness and willingness to get involved—whether it's locking your doors, turning on outdoor lights, or

calling when something doesn't look right—helps prevent crime before it happens. Here are a few crime prevention tips:

- Lock all vehicle doors and close all windows and the sunroof every time you leave your car unattended – however briefly.
- Don't warm up your vehicle unattended. Criminals drive through neighborhoods looking for cars that have been left running.
- Keep your home doors locked at all times — including garage doors.
- Get to know your neighbors. It is easier for homeowners to spot suspicious activity if neighbors know each other.
- Don't let strangers into your home. Criminals knock on doors and attempt to get into your house to harm you or see what they can steal.

LAWN CARE

City code prohibits grass, weeds, or other noxious plants from exceeding 12 inches in height. When a property is in violation, owners are notified by letter and given a correction deadline that accounts for weather conditions such as rain. If the property remains out of compliance after the deadline, a tall grass sign is placed in the yard.

If the violation continues, the City will hire contractors to cut the grass and weeds. Costs—including contractor fees—are added to the property maintenance case and may ultimately be recouped through a tax lien on the property.

MUNICIPAL COURT

The NKC Municipal Court is part of the state judicial system and handles traffic and city ordinance violations issued by NKC Police, Animal Control, and Code Enforcement. Court is held most Monday evenings at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall.

TREE CANOPY

Public Works is responsible for the planting and maintenance of approximately 3,000 city-owned trees located in the public right-of-way. To help manage and promote a healthy urban tree canopy, the city removes, replaces, and prunes city-owned trees on an annual basis. If you have any tree questions or concerns, call 816-274-6004.

OUTDOOR FIRES

Open burning is prohibited by City ordinance; however, residents may use portable fireplaces include chimineas, fire pits with spark arrestors, and outdoor fireplaces. Outdoor fire requirements include:

- Only burn seasoned firewood.
- Burning trash, lumber, or yard waste is prohibited.
- Fireplaces must be at least 15 feet away from structures and combustible materials.
- The fire must be constantly attended until it is completely extinguished.
- At least one fire extinguisher, or another approved method (dirt, sand, a water barrel, or garden hose), must be available for immediate use.

CLAY COUNTY TAXES
